Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to approve travel for Terri Halls, Elections, to attend the Spring Workshop in Pierre on May 7-8, 2014. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to approve service agreements with Election Systems and Software for software and firmware support at an annual cost of \$1,872.00 and authorize the Auditor to sign. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Takes The Shield, seconded by Hutchison, to approve locating the Early Voting Center in Pine Ridge in the H&R Block building on Highway 18, a space formerly known as Shangreaux Market. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to approve hiring Jean Belt as the Lakota Election Coordinator at \$14.00 per hour. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Takes The Shield, seconded by Hutchison, to approve a lease agreement with Richard Shangreaux for the Early Voting Center location from April 15, 2014 through November 15, 2014 at \$250.00 per month. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to approve updated SNAP / Thrift plan income guidelines for 2014 welfare eligibility. With no further discussion and all voting yes,

the motion carried.

Auditor Ganje presented the Auditor's 2013 Annual Report, and the PT 92 (report of taxes collected) to the Board.

Pat Ginsbach, Deputy State's Attorney, and Jim Bingham, Shannon County Mental Health Chairman, met with the Board to discuss a request by Lucy Lewno, Chair of the Yankton County Board of Mental Illness for payment of submitted claims. The claims were submitted prior to their receipt of a letter stating Shannon County would not be responsible for claims for services provided to tribal members as the county is the last means of payment. Formation of a Shannon County Mental Health Board was discussed, which could review billings on a case by case basis, along with the State's Attorney office. Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to authorize Bingham to form a Shannon County Mental Health Board and submit recommended names for appointment to the Board. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Takes The Shield, seconded by Hutchison, to pay bills submitted for December 2013 and January 2014 for mental health associated services, which were prior to the county's notice that it would not be responsible. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to authorize Bingham and a representative of the State's Attorney office to go to Aberdeen to negotiate a reimbursement rate for services for tribal members. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

A billing from Behavior Management was reviewed; the Board requested that Alan Solano be asked to provide an explanation of services.

Susie Hayes, Director of Equalization, provided documentation that the Wounded Knee Community Development Corporation should be exempt as a tribal organization. Hayes questioned whether they need to apply for exempt status annually and how much of the property should be exempt. Ginsbach stated the application should be made annually, the building would be exempt and up to 80 acres if the land qualifies as ag land, per SDCL, with the balance of any property subject to property tax. The exemption rule for five acres of land was discussed, along with the classification of parcels. Hayes stated they would review exempt properties on a case-by-case basis and that one appeal was filed for review this year.

The Board discussed setting a date for convening the Board of Equalization; the matter will be set after the April 1, 2014 deadline for appeals. Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes the Shield to set April 23, 2014 at 12:00 noon for Equalization purposes. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Kelli Rhoe, Acting Treasurer, informed the Board that staff has been reviewing

delinquent tax agreements, delinquent taxes and properties eligible for tax deeds. Rhoe asked for permission to close some accounts. Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to close the Wells Fargo checking and savings accounts due to monthly service fees. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, updated the Board on department activity and the purchase of a mower, which was previously approved. Fuel quotes were presented:

Motion by Hutchison, seconded by Takes The Shield, to approve the bills as presented, with the exception of mental health billings. With no further discussion and all voting yes, the motion carried.
