OGLALA LAKOTA COUNTY MINUTES OF APRIL 16, 2018

The Oglala Lakota Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on April 16, 2018. Present: Lyla Hutchison, Art Hopkins, Arlin Whirlwindhorse and Sue Ganje, Auditor. Wendell Yellow Bull and Anna Takes the Shield were absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was stated and the meeting called to order at 1:36 p.m. by Vice-Chairman Hutchison. The agenda was reviewed for conflicts. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the minutes of March 2, 2018.

Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Whirlwindhorse, to approve the February 28, 2018 Auditor's Account with the County Treasurer.

Motion made by Whirlwind Horse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve travel for the Auditor and Register of Deeds to attend the SDACO 2018 Spring Workshop, Pierre, May 15 and 16, 2018.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve travel for the Auditor and Treasurer deputies to attend the SDACO 2018 Deputy Workshop, Pierre, June 13, 2018.

Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Whirlwindhorse, to approve a letter from SD Secretary of State to the OST President asking for poll workers and translators in Oglala Lakota County elections.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to table the agenda item on changing the polling place until later in the meeting.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins to approve the hiring of early vote election workers as follows: Jean Belt, \$16.00/hour; Agnes Westover, \$12.00/hour; Michel Melvin, \$12.00/hour and Charlotte Dismounts Thrice, \$12.00/hour.

The board reviewed documentation from the SD Public Utilities Commission in the Matter of the Filing by Lookout Solar Park I Project regarding its Notification of Intent to Apply for a Permit for an Energy Conversion Facility in Oglala Lakota County. Other entities notified include President Troy "Scott" Weston of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, and the Oglala Lakota School District. The following entities were also notified as they are within six miles of the proposed site: Custer County Commissioners, Fall River County Commissioners, Hot Springs School District and the Custer County School District.

Susie Simkins, Director of Equalization, met with the board. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve travel for Frances Dennison, Appraiser, to the 70th Annual Conference for the SD Association of Assessing Officers, May 22 through May 25, 2018, in Rapid City, SD.

Simkins presented an abatement. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to abate taxes for Vernon Sager, parcel number 90000-01972-00300, 2017 pay 2018, \$37.85. Reason: Mobile Home was destroyed in a tornado and later burned down.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, met with the board, reporting on the question of guardrails, noting that the cost is expensive and can sometimes be a hazard. There are grant funds for these, but a fatality needs to happen before you can apply for the grant. The board asked Bettelyoun to find costs for posts with reflectors or cable, he will report on that at the next meeting.

Bettelyoun advised he is looking into a treatment for gravel, which reduces dust and helps maintain the gravel, which will save the County money in the long run. Bettelyoun would like to test it on 3 or 4 miles of road and go from there.

Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Whirlwindhorse, to approve a transfer to reimburse the highway department for sheriff fuel, 87.7 gallons at \$2.33 per gallon for a total of \$204.25.

Bettelyoun presented fuel quotes as follows:

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the low and only bid from Westco at \$2.286 per gallon for 520 gallons of unleaded gas, \$2.419 per gallon for 1,300 gallons of #1 dyed diesel.

A recap of bids for the Kyle Road Aggregate Resurfacing Project, Phase 3 was presented to the board by Ross Eberle, Brosz Engineering. The following bids were received: Western Construction, Inc, Rapid City - \$221,110.00; Opperman, Inc, Gregory, SD - \$302,400, and Dakota Constructors, Inc., Harrisburg, SD - \$177,091.00. Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Whirlwindhorse, to approve the Notice of Award to Dakota Constructors Inc., in the amount of \$177,091.00; the construction contract document from Brosz Engineers, and authorize the chairman to sign.

Denise Mesteth, OST, and Trudy Ecoffey, NRCS Tribal Liaison, met with the board to discuss the previously submitted request for a livestock water pipeline. Discussion was also held on the possibility of a Memorandum of Understanding between the county and tribe about roads, which Mesteth advised she cannot do. The water project was discussed, noting need, cost and the county's request for assurance that affected county roads would not be damaged. Bettelyoun will work with Ecoffey, and a review of roads will be done before payment to contractors. Bettelyoun will also continue to work with the BIA and OST for an agreement on haul road agreements. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the Application for Permit to Occupy County Highway Right-of-Way for the Oglala Sioux Tribe located from Section 34, Township 36, Range 47 to Section 23, Township 36, Range 48.

Kelli Rhoe, Treasurer, met with the board to advise that the Oglala Sioux Tribe has been working with the SD Department of Motor Vehicles to create a tribal plate. The plate should be done by May 1, 2018 and would work anywhere in the state. Official notification should be coming from the State of SD.

Rex Conroy, Sheriff, met with the board. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by

Hopkins, to approve the sheriff's monthly report and place it on file.

Cole Adams, Democratic Field Organizer, met with the board to discuss the possibility of more than one early vote site to encourage increased voter turnout. Discussion was also held about workers that Adams and others were getting to help and some inappropriate behavior by party workers in 2016.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to adjourn as a Board of County Commissioners and reconvene as a County Board of Equalization at 3:05 pm. A break was taken then.

The County Board of Equalization was called to order at 3:18 p.m. Director of Equalization Simkins reviewed the responsibilities of the board and the oath of office was taken by board members.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to accept the local meeting minutes from the Town of Batesland.

The exempt list was reviewed. The board will address it later in the meeting.

Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the owner-occupied classification code changes filed by March 15, 2018 as per codified law. Kenneth Gibson met with the board via teleconference on the increased value due to property going from agriculture to non-agriculture. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins, to make no change, as per the Director of Equalization's recommendation for Kenneth Gibson, appeal #2018-02, parcel number 55000-04147-16100.

Basil and Charlotte Braveheart and Mark Marshall, Attorney, met with the board to request exempt status. Motion made by Whirlwindhorse, seconded by Hopkins to approve 5 acres and a building to exempt, leaving the value of the land at \$4,820.00, for Basil and Charlotte Braveheart, appeal #2018-6, parcel number #13000-03645-16100.

Denise Mesteth, OST, met with the board.
