# OGLALA LAKOTA COUNTY UNAPPROVED MINUTES OF APRIL 5, 2019

The Oglala Lakota Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on April 5, 2019. Present: Ramon Bear Runner, Art Hopkins, Anna Takes the Shield, Wendell Yellow Bull and Sue Ganje, Auditor. Eugenio White Hawk was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting called to order at 10:35 a.m. by Chairwoman Takes the Shield. The agenda was reviewed for conflicts. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Yellow Bull, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the minutes of March 8, 2019 and March 21, 2019. With Yellow Bull abstaining, all others voting yes, motion carries.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the Auditor's Account with the Treasurer as follows:

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve travel for officials to attend the spring workshop on May 14 and May 15, 2019 in Pierre.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, met with the board. The 2018 yearend report on project costs were not presented at this time, but will be emailed to commissioners when available. Bettelyoun advised the board of approximately 80% of culverts being washed out after the storm. Discussion was held on road progress, culvert sizes and costs. Bettelyoun will be looking for a new employee as Matt Thunder Hawk has left employment with the county.

White Hawk joined the meeting at 10:47 a.m.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by White Hawk, to approve a transfer to reimburse the highway department for sheriff fuel, 117.3 gallons at \$2.114 per gallon, for a total of \$247.97.

Westco \$2.464/gal \$2.969/gal Pine Ridge Oil No Bid No Bid Nelson's No Bid No Bid Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by White Hawk, to approve the low and only bid from Westco at \$2.464 per gallon for 300 gallons of unleaded gas for a total of \$739.20 and \$2.969 per gallon for 1500 gallons of #1 dyed diesel for a total of \$4,453.50.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by White Hawk, to approve the agreement between the Town of Batesland and the County, and authorize the chairwoman to sign.

Joe Herman, Sheriff, met with the board to review and discuss his monthly report, noting that he assisted the Highway Department and residents during the last storm. He advised the board of a meeting with the Pennington County Sherriff and other area sheriffs concerning Mental Health programs and facilities in West River, in which they are invited also. Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by White Hawk to approve the monthly sheriff report and place on file.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by White Hawk, to approve travel for Herman to attend the Spring Sheriff & Police Chiefs Conference, April 23 through April 25, 2019, in Deadwood.

Herman also spoke of dam management and the possible flooding issues that it was causing downstream.

The bid opening for County Road #11 Aggregate Resurfacing Project, Phase 1 was held as advertised. Bids were received from the following:

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the low bid of Dakota Contractors, Inc., to crush approximately 15,000 ton for use by the Oglala Lakota County Highway Department and supply approximately 10,000 ton of Aggregate gravel surfacing Material, beginning 6 miles west of Batesland on SD State Highway 18 and continuing north until all hauled material is used, at a cost of \$215,000.00.

Marilyn Parmenter met with the board via teleconference to discuss road conditions after the storm on Winner road, the county road where her grandmother lives. Bettelyoun acknowledged frustrations by residents county-wide, but noted financial limitations on county roads for maintenance. Bettelyoun advised they had broken thru the snow banks on Winner Road on the 18<sup>th</sup>, but that he would re-check the road as soon as possible.

Takes the Shield excited the meeting and vice-chairman took over the meeting at 11:50 a.m.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Yellow Bull to approve the Disaster Declaration Resolution as follows and authorize the vice-chairman to sign:

# OGLALA LAKOTA COUNTY RESOLUTION #2019-03

WHEREAS, Oglala Lakota County, South Dakota on March 13, 2019 through still ongoing has suffered severe storm damage caused by a heavy wet snow storm resulting in widespread flooding issues, and

WHEREAS, this severe storm caused road damage, property flooding and loss of access, loss of livestock, and

WHEREAS, Oglala Lakota County has incurred huge expenses as they endeavor to provide road repair and access to residents of the county and had extensive repairs and replacement of equipment, and

NOT IT BE RESOLVED THAT the Oglala Lakota County Commissioners do hereby declare a disaster for the population of the area impacted.

The Oglala Lakota County commissioners respectfully request that any and all assistance that may be available from State and Federal agencies be provided to all local governments to included Oglala Lakota County and to the local business and general population as we work to overcome this disaster.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED THAT the Oglala Lakota County Commissioners do hereby declare a flooding and Winter storm disaster and respectfully request the Governor of the State of South Dakota to declare a disaster area and to request a Presidential Declaration of Disaster to insure that the maximum amount of assistance is made available to local governments, businesses and residents affected.
