## OGLALA LAKOTA COUNTY APPROVED MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 12, 2020

The Oglala Lakota Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on February 12, 2020. Present: Art Hopkins, Ramon Bear Runner, Eugenio White Hawk, Wendell Yellow Bull and Sue Ganje, Auditor. Anna Takes the Shield was absent.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given, and the meeting called to order at 1:26 p.m. by Vice-chairman White Hawk. The agenda was reviewed for conflicts. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Bear Runner briefly discussed a resolution for the 2020 census and the auditor discussed a polling place resolution and a facility use permit. They were unable to get these items on the agenda in time. A special meeting will be set up.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the agenda as written.

Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the minutes of January 8, 2020 and January 13, 2020.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the Auditor's Account with the Treasurer as follows:

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to set aside resolution #95-8 in the event they want to update, and for it to no longer be in effect unless updated.

Bear Runner presented maps and discussed the census resolution, noting the importance that all individuals are counted as this helps the county and tribe qualify for funding in each jurisdiction.

White Hawk, Vice Chairman, signed the 2020 initial Boundary Validation Program (BVP), noting that the legal boundary for our government (county) is correct.

Susie Hayes, Director of Equalization, met with the board to present abatement and refund requests. Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Yellow Bull, to approve a refund for Pine Ridge Baptist Church, parcel #09000-03641-304-20, for '17 pay '18 taxes, in the amount of \$4,764.54. Reason: Church was granted tax exempt status in 2015, do not need to re-file until 2020, so should not have been taxed.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the abatement for Edson R. Briggs, parcel #80000-00200-002-00, for '19 pay '20 taxes, in the amount of \$90.37. Reason: Property valued at 100%, should have had an 80% partial complete OBSO applied to the value.

Lynx Bettelyoun met with the board. Fuel quotes were presented as follows:

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the low and only bid from Westco at \$2.469 per gallon for 550 gallons (or full) of unleaded gas for a total amount of \$1,357.95 and \$2.469 per gallon for 900 gallons (or full) of Ruby diesel for a total of \$2,222.10.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the private road contract for Kelly Jensen, in the amount of \$468.00 for road work and snow removal.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve travel for Bettelyoun, to attend the Short Course in Deadwood on March 25 and March 26, 2020.

Bettelyoun presented his 5-year plan for gravel and culvert projects, starting in 2020. Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner to accept the 5-year plan for the Highway Department.

Bettelyoun updated the board on activities. Discussion was held on road project costs and training.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the December 20, 2019 through January 27, 2020 sheriff fuel transfer to reimburse the highway for 327.6 gallons of fuel at \$2.605 per gallon, for a total of \$853.40.

The 2020 private road work hearing was held as advertised. Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner to continue with private road work as per SDCL 31-11-41 through 31-11-45.

Kelli Rhoe, Treasurer, met with the board to discuss the criteria for a Kiosk in the county for license plate renewals and possible locations. Rhoe will continue correspondence with the state, visit possible locations.

Joe Herman, Sheriff, presented an overview of activities in 2019 by his department, which included total budget spent, inventory list, incident report (by category), staff/training and patrol vehicle status. Herman noted that Deputy Davis's work included tracking down over 200 missing or stolen cattle, with the suspect(s) turned over to the tribe. Herman gave information on the search for the missing men, and noted he applied for a \$10,000 Homeland Security Grant for a drone.

Art Hopkins, Commissioner, discussed with the board an optional alternate form of government he had read about. State's Attorney Ahrendt advised that a county manager worked with resolutions and board regulations, attended meetings, prepared and administered budgets and advised the board of their financial situations. A county manager could appoint and hire staff to assist in the administration of county affairs, and other duties assigned by the board. Ahrendt noted that this form of government was utilized more in larger counties and would cost more money.

Discussion was held on the upcoming Oglala Sioux Tribe referendum election that could legalize alcohol at the casinos and legalize recreational and medical marijuana. Also discussed were the licenses and jurisdictional issues. The auditor will give a follow up on that at the next meeting.

Discussion was held on commissioner training for a better understanding of contracts, laws and memorandum of agreements, and handbooks and/or look at websites to help further their knowledge.

Discussion on the 211-resource database will be brought back to the next meeting.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to hold a special meeting on Friday, February 14, 2020, at 10 a.m., via teleconference, for the census resolution and election items.
