The Oglala Lakota Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on November 14, 2022. Present: Art Hopkins, Anna Takes the Shield (DuBray) Eugenio White Hawk and Aaron Eberle, Administrative Assistant, Auditor's Office. Ramon Bear Runner, Wendell Yellow Bull and Sue Ganje, Auditor, were absent.

The meeting was called to order at 1:18 p.m. by Chairman White Hawk and the pledge was given. The agenda was reviewed for conflicts; none were noted. ALL MOTIONS RECORDED IN THESE MINUTES WERE PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE, UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

Bear Runner joined the meeting at 1:38 p.m.

The Official Canvass for the 2022 General Election was conducted. Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Takes the Shield (DuBray), to approve the Official 2022 General Election Canvass.

No public comment was heard.

Motion made by Takes the Shield (DuBray), seconded by Hopkins, to approve tabling the delinquent tax agreement and waiving of interest policy until the next meeting, when the Treasurer could be available.

Stacey Martin, GIS, reported to the Board, that she has been doing research regarding online mapping programs that would be affordable for them and Fall River County. Martin will bring back a quote to the next meeting. This would allow time for Martin to do further research and get a better feel for Fall River County's decision will be and if both boards wanted to go together.

Joe Herman, Sheriff, reported to the Board that 2 deputies have resigned and 2 vehicles will probably need to be sold or traded off in the future. Herman will get quotes if funding will be allowable. Discussion was held on Herman helping the Oglala Lakota Sioux Tribe search for missing tribal members; the County's side by sides have been being used in the search, one of the older ones will need to be replaced.

Discussion was held on setting up a Dispatch Center at the Highway Shop, since Oglala Lakota County is lower on the priority list with the Tribe and Fall River County. The Board questioned having Audrey Martinez assist more with sheriff duties, reports of stolen/missing cattle, hours that Sheriff was putting in, getting a policy in place sooner rather than later, having written

reports at meetings, tribal work that may be stressing him and different ways of hiring better employees.

Motion made by Takes the Shield (Dubray), seconded by Yellow Bull, to table the sheriff's report until Herman can come back with a written report.

Bear Runner exited the meeting at 3:19 p.m.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board. Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Takes the Shield (DuBray), to approve the October 1 – October 25, 2022 sheriff fuel transfer to reimburse the highway for 386.9 gallons of fuel at \$3.882 per gallon, for a total of \$1,501.95.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Takes the Shield (DuBray), to approve the low and only bid from Westco for 550 gallons of gasoline at \$3.649 per gallon, for a total of \$2,006.95, 1,000 gallons of diesel, at \$5.199 per gallon, for a total of \$5,199.00, and 600 gallons of propane at \$1.999 per gallon, for a total of \$1,199.40.

Bettelyoun updated the Board that a concrete pad has been poured for the new fuel tank and they have also prepared a small sidewalk.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Takes the Shield (DuBray), to approve travel for the 2022 Annual Safety and Loss Control Training Conference, November 2 and November 3, 2022, at the Ramkota in Pierre, SD.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve hosting the Black Hills Association of Highway Superintendents Meeting on December 7, 2022 at Prairie Winds Casino, in the amount of \$301.00.

Bettelyoun updated the Board that the reshaping of County Road #6 has been going well. The Highway Department has replaced the rear pins in the Batwing mower, changed the oil in the 2021 motor grader and replaced the fuel shut off cable in the 1990 Oshkosh Water Tanker. Bettelyoun stated that they have Blade 16A, 16, 2, 7, hauled 100 Tons of gravel to 16A and 75 tons of gravel to 2. The mowing is done on 7, 2, 11, 8, 15, 16A and 16.

Stacy Schmidt, Deputy Auditor, met with the Board. Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Takes the Shield (DuBray), to approve adding the storage container onto the insurance.

Discussion was held on keeping the booster vaccine incentive the same as the initial motion made on October 12, 2022.

Discussion was held on supervisors hiring employees as needed, then bring to the board for approval. The Board agreed that if the supervisor would call between meetings to get a temporary hire approval, that would be sufficient.

Discussion was held on implementing the Sheriff's Department policy into the county wide employee policy the Board is working on.

Concerns were raised about not having enough work for Dispatchers in Oglala Lakota County, providing more work for current employees and the closeness that was lost with the OST Tribal Police Department and using the Zuercher Dispatch System through them.

Motion made by Takes the Shield (DuBray), seconded by Yellow Bull, to approve having a special meeting on December 2, 2022 for a working session on the employee policy to begin at 9:00 a.m. and to include Sheriff Herman bringing his policy proposal.

Motion made by Takes the Shield (DuBray), seconded by Yellow Bull, to enter into executive session as per SDCL 1-25-2 (1) for personnel purposes at 4:18 p.m.

Meeting resumed at 4:32 p.m.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to submit any information to the State's Attorney's office regarding Sheriff Herman's transparency.



I have also been reviewing Oglala Lakota County property values and would like to discuss a few items.

I have attached the property worksheet from your Safety Benefits property.

When Oglala Lakota County's property valuation was conducted, Safety Benefits identified one property currently unscheduled:

- Highway Storage Unit in Batesland

This structure can be covered under the property coverage that the County has with the SDPAA. We have provided a quote for the highway storage unit. Please review this value as well as the property itself and let us know if you would like to add this to your property schedule. If not, we will simply exclude them from the property coverage.

For the balance of the property locations, we are now required to ensure that your property values listed on the statement of values are at least 100% of the values prepared by Safety Benefits to maintain replacement cost coverage. For those locations covered at actual cash value, 85% of the Safety Benefits value is required. Currently, Oglala Lakota County's properties are listed at replacement cost. We have provided quotes for updating these values to maintain the currently selected valuation. Please review this information and let me know if there are any questions.

If the County does not wish to update the values, we can also move these locations to stated value coverage.

Definitions/Application:

Blanket Limit: The most that would be paid for any one occurrence (example – hail or windstorm, building collapse etc.) regardless of the number of locations involved.

Replacement Cost Coverage (RCV) – this valuation will pay the lessor of the cost to repair damaged property or replace it with like kind and quality materials subject to the blanket limit associated with the County's statement of values. This amount is currently \$258,348.00.

Actual Cash Value Coverage (ACV) – this valuation will pay the lessor of the cost to repair damaged property, or the value of the property based on the age and condition of the property at the time of the loss. The most that would be paid in any one loss is the blanket limit associated with the County's Statement of Values.

Stated Value Coverage (SV) – this valuation will pay the lessor of the cost to repair damaged property, or the cost to replace damaged property with like kind and quality materials subject to the value associated with the specifically damaged property. For example: If the Shop Building was completely destroyed and covered at Stated Value, the most that would be paid would be the cost to repair the property or rebuild it with like kind and quality materials, but the payment would not currently exceed \$168,256 as that is the value associated with the location on the statement of values.

The additional contribution due would be \$141.72 to right size these two properties to 100% of replacement costs by Safety Benefits recommendations. If you would like to meet and discuss the potential changes and options in person, please let me know. If you have any questions regarding the quotes, options for updating values etc. please feel free to reach out via phone/email or text.

Otherwise, please let me know how the County would like to proceed by November 8th, 2022. If we don't hear from you, we will move replacement cost coverage properties to stated value and will exclude the one unscheduled property.

I. PAYMENT ALLOCATION DETERMINATION

This Notice is an official communication from the Directing Administrator of the National Opioid Settlements. A copy of this Notice has been sent to the Enforcement Committee and Settling Distributors pursuant to Section IV.B of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, dated as of July 21, 2021, as amended, between and among the Settling States, the Settling Distributors, and Participating Subdivisions (the "Distributor Settlement Agreement"). All capitalized terms used in this letter have the meanings ascribed to them in the Distributor Settlement Agreement.

Pursuant to Section IV.B and Exhibit M of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, South Dakota's Total Payment Year 2 amount is **\$1,807,559.46**, which is broken down in Table 1 in Attachment 1 to this Allocation Notice.

As provided under Section V.C of the Distributor Settlement Agreement, South Dakota has instructed the Directing Administrator to calculate the intrastate allocations pursuant to a State-Subdivision Agreement ("South Dakota Opioid Settlement Memorandum of Agreement"). Section II.A. of the State-Subdivision Agreement states that "all Opioid Funds will be divided proportionally with 70% allocated to the State (Statewide Share) and 30% allocated to the Participating Local Governments (Localized Share) pursuant to SDCL 34-20B-116." The Agreement further states that the "Localized Share will be allocated to the Participating Local Governments in the proportions set out in Exhibit B, attached hereto, ... which is based upon the opioid negotiation class model developed in connection with In re: Nat'l Prescription Opiate Litigation, MDL 2804 (N.D. Ohio)." The Agreement further states that "if a county or city listed on Exhibit B does not join this MOU, then that non-Participating Local Government's allocation of the Localized Share...will be reallocated to the Statewide Share." Section IV.A. of the Agreement indicates that the "Statewide Share will be distributed to the opioid abatement and remediation fund" and the "Localized Share will be distributed directly to each Participating Local Government." The intrastate allocations are included as Attachment 1 to this Allocation Notice.

Undisputed amounts allocated to the Statewide Share and Localized Share for Participating Subdivisions will be paid no later than the date that is 50 days after the date of this Allocation Notice.

II. YOUR RIGHT TO DISPUTE

Section IV.B.4 of the Distributor Settlement Agreement provides that within twenty-one (21) calendar days of receiving notice any party may dispute the calculation of the amount to be received by a Settling State or its Participating Subdivisions listed on Exhibit G as inconsistent with the terms of the Agreement. Written notice must be provided to the Settlement Fund Administrator, the Enforcement Committee, any affected Settling State, and the Settling Distributors identifying the nature of the dispute, the amount of money that is disputed, and the Settling State(s) affected.

A party has until the Deadline to Dispute Allocation listed at the top of this Allocation Notice to deliver a written notification of dispute. The amounts listed in this Allocation Notice will be deemed accepted if the Directing Administrator has not received a party's dispute before midnight Eastern Time on the deadline date. Submit your written request by email to DirectingAdministrator@NationalOpioidOfficialSettlement.com.

Any party affected by the dispute may object to the notification of dispute. Depending on the nature of the dispute, contested disputes must be resolved in either the court that entered a state's Consent Judgment or the National Arbitration Panel. The Directing Administrator will not disburse any funds potentially affected by a contested dispute until the dispute is resolved by the court or the National Arbitration Panel.

III. TO ACCEPT PAYMENT

If you do not dispute the payment and you have previously created a Portal Account and completed your Payment Election Forms and W-9 Forms, no further action is needed. The Directing Administrator will begin issuing payments after the applicable deadlines have passed using the existing payment instructions. If you have not previously created a Portal Account, please do so and complete the Payment Election Forms and W-9 Forms to create payment instructions for any Settlement Payments. **Keep your payment instructions current in the Portal as the Directing Administrator will use these forms to issue settlement payments.**

IV. TO REALLOCATE PAYMENT

If you wish to reallocate your portion of the allocation to another Participating Subdivision or the State Fund, you may notify the Directing Administrator of your intent to do so using the Direct Payment and Allocation Election screen on the Portal before the Deadline to Dispute Allocation included on the Allocation Notice. The Directing Administrator will not treat a reallocation request as a dispute.

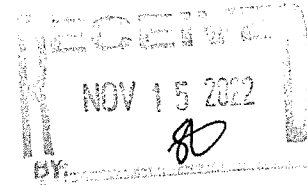
