Subject: Extreme Close Quarter Concepts Training July 5-7, 2023 in Hot Springs

The Fall River County Sheriff's Office will be hosting ShivWorks Extreme Close Quarter Concepts (ECQC) training <u>Wednesday, July 5 - Friday, July 7, 2023.</u> This is a three-day, 30-hour module designed specifically for law enforcement. Training will take place at the Fall River Gun Club (27386 SD Hwy 79, Hot Springs, SD 57747) and at the Fall River County South Annex classroom (709 Jensen Hwy, Hot Springs, SD 57747).

The attached flyer details class times/dates, topics to be covered, and weapon/gear requirements.

The cost for the course is \$650.00 per person (meals and gear not included). The course is limited to 20 students so please book early.

ShivWorks is offering a law enforcement only rendition of the proven ShivWorks Extreme Close Quarter Concepts (ECQ) curriculum with an additional dedicated edged weapons module. The course is a three day (30 hour) block of instruction which focuses on a multi-disciplinary approach to building functional, combative handgun skills at zero to five feet. The course is de-signed to instill core concepts of seamless integration and provide the platform for aggressive problem solving a life or death struggle. A heavy emphasis is placed upon congruency of body mechanics between skill sets. One the student's skill sets are initially ingrained, the participant will be stress inoculated with force on force drills utilizing marking cartridges and protective equipment. The contextual elements of the coursework are driven and centered around lone law enforcement of-ficer who may find themselves entangled, standing or grounded with one or more opponents in weapons based environment.

Topics covered include:

Day One (10 hours):

- o Introduction to the components of the Compative Drawstroke
- o Building the #2 (thumb-pectoral index) position in live-fire
- o Appropriate compressed firing positions based on proximity of threat
- o Off-hand fending positions
- o The Operating System of Pressure, Posture, and Position
- o Functional standing entanglement curriculum, Escapes and tie-ups
- o Theory of In-Fight Weapons Access and contact range presentations
- o Horizontal entanglement (grounded) strategy template
- o 1 vs. 1 grounded validation exercise

Day Two (10 hours):

- o The Criminal Assault Paradigm and the nature of unequal initiative
- o Reading body language and Pre-Assault Cues
- o Managing Field Contacts and common control mistakes
- o Initiation strategies and basic strikes
- o Full Spectrum Contact to Conclusion 2 vs. 1 validation exercise

Day Three (8 hours):

- o Handgun Retention in and out of the holster.
- o Handgun disarms, standing and grounded
- o Edged tool survey, Folders vs. Fixed blades
- o Point and edge application and In-Extremis usage
- o Augmenting firearms retention with edged weapons
- o Final evolution/validation exercise

Weapon & Gear Class Requirements:

- o Reliable handgun, quality holster, magazine pouches, and a minimum of two (2) magazines.
- o 200 rounds of ammunition, weapon lubrication and cleaning supplies.
- o Mouthpiece and cup, heavy sweatshirt or soft body armor
- o Seasonal weather gear
- o Ballistic Eye protection & Ear protection
- o Good attitude

Recommended but not required are a pair of boxing gloves and a pair of MMA sparring gloves that allow a firing grip to be acquired on the handgun.

Students should be relatively fit as this is a contact class. Most of the latter half of each day will be spent utilizing marking cartridges at FIST helmets, to allow the students to gain confidence in applying their newly acquired skills against moving aggressive opponents. ShivWorks coursework is generally anaerobic in nature and the student may experience mild to greater than mild impact during the training.

Instructor: Craig Douglas is a retired 21 year police officer and former commander of his agency's SWAT team. Craig was a full-time police officer from 1990-2011 and held line assignments in corrections, patrol, narcotics, investi-gations, and habeen a narcotics group supervisor. He was also the primary defensive tactics instructor at the Southern Regional Public Safety Institute from 1992-1999 and has personally trained over five thousand police officers at the acade-my level. Craig has extensive operational experience in an undercover capacity which is reflected heavily in the Extreme Close Quarter Concepts coursework. Craig has a thirty year background in Phillipine, Indonesian, Brazillian and Japanese martial arts art is a veteran of the U.S. Army. He has been conducting training in the private sector in the U.S. and abroad for the past 19 years.
