Anna Takes the Shield (Dubray) entered the meeting at 1:38 pm and took the meeting over as Chairwoman.

Kim McNemar, Behavior Management, presented the 2024 Behavior Management budget request along with a letter with statistics regarding their outreach.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the fuel transfer from the Sheriff Department to reimburse the Highway Department for fuel used in the amount of 100.4 gallons at \$3.49 per gallon, to equal \$350.40.

Motion made by Bear Runner, to approve the Hauling Contract with Lee Ranch Trucking, contingent upon the approval of State's Attorney Russell. Motion failed due to lack of a second.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to table approval of the Hauling Contract with Lee Ranch Trucking until State's Attorney Russell can answer questions on the contract.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve hiring Kelly Ferguson, permanent full-time with a CDL for the Highway Department with a starting wage of \$20.00 per hour.

Motion made by Bear Runner, seconded by Yellow Bull, to approve the purchase of five auto gates in the amount of \$2,680.00 each plus shipping for 16' and one 20' gate in the amount of \$3,160.00 for County Rd 6 and County Rd 27.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve purchasing a 48"x 20' culvert in the amount of \$2,145.00.

Bettelyoun presented the 2024 Highway Department budget request and updates to the Board.

Jerlene Arredondo, Veteran Service Officer, presented the 2024 Veteran Service Office budget request. Arredondo informed the Board that she had been notified that, due to the VA funding running out on September 30, 2023, they may be shutting down the shelter where her office is located, the County will need to find another office space.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to place the May, 2023 Veteran Service Office's report on file.

Lance Russell, State's Attorney, presented the 2024 State's Attorney Office budget request. He noted that there will be an increase in prosecution cases as the Supreme Court has ruled that the County has jurisdiction if a non-member of the Tribe commits a crime against a Tribal member.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, add onto next agenda to approve splitting out Elected Official's Salary reporting in the official newspaper.

Russell requested that the Board meet with the Fall River County Commissioners to go over the contract between both counties in September or October.

Anna Takes the Shield, Chairwoman, asked that everyone look over the County Highway Building proposal that would be paid for by ARPA funding. Much discussion about different plans and ideas took place.

Bear Runner exited the meeting at 3:12 pm.

Memorandum of Agreement

Between the Prairie Wind Casino of the Oglala Sioux Tribe on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation and Oglala Lakota County

For Law Enforcement Services

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is made and entered into on this day of
, 2023, By and between Oglala Lakota County, the Prairie Wind Casino, and the
Oglala Sioux Tribe on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. This MOA will begin upon its execution
and renew on an annual basis.

PURPOSE

To develop cooperative efforts between the Tribe and County where law enforcement services for Non-Natives are provided for on the property of Prairie Wind Casino, which is located in Oglala Lakota County, within the Exterior Boundaries of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, in Oglala South Dakota. The property includes but is not limited to: the Prairie Wind Casino, Hotel, Bingo Hall, various maintenance buildings, parking lot, and other future development on the said property.

2. GOAL

The County will assist the Tribe in providing the described services to the employees and patrons of the Tribally Owned enterprise located on the property, and subject to the limitations provided in this Memorandum of Agreement.

3. LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

The County agrees to provide law enforcement services to the extent, and in the manner, as follows:

A. The County will utilize the Prairie Wind Casino as an extra office area as needed, and as determined by the Oglala Lakota County Sheriff providing Law Enforcement Services as needed when it comes to Non-Native customers, as well as provide a visual sense of safety for all.

B. The provisions of services, the standards of performance, the discipline of the deputies, and other matters incident to the performance of such services, and the control of personnel so employed, shall remain under the control of the Oglala Lakota County.

C. It is agreed that the Sheriff of Oglala Lakota County shall have all reasonable and necessary cooperation and assistance from the Prairie Wind Casino, its officers, agents, and employees, so as to facilitate the performance of this Agreement.

- D. The Tribe, its officers and employees shall not be liable for the compensation or indemnification of the Sheriff, or any of his employees, for injuries or sickness arising out of their actions under this MOA. The County hereby agrees to hold harmless the Tribe, its officers, and employees against such claims, whether to person or property.
- E. The Tribe shall incur no liability for the intentional or negligent acts or omissions of the County, or its officers, agents, or employees in enforcing State Law over Non-Natives, or from actions by County personnel against persons sentenced or ordered to the custody of the State of South Dakota or the County.
- G. The Sheriff of the County will enforce State Laws only over Non-Native Americans on the property and will not have any jurisdiction over Tribal Members or any registered enrolled member of any Tribe. The Tribe may however allow the said officers to enforce Tribal Law.

4. CONDITIONS

Nothing in this MOA shall expand or limit the legislative, regulatory, or adjudicatory jurisdiction of either party or the State of South Dakota. This MOA shall not be construed to and does not limit or otherwise affect either party's sovereign powers, including but not limited to either party's sovereign immunities.

5. TERM AND PAYMENT

In consideration for the government services provided in this MOA, the Prairie Wind Casino agrees to provide as follows:

- Office Space at no charge, to include utilities, internet and a computer.
- The Oglala Lakota County Sheriff shall provide basic Law Enforcement services and provide a visual impact for all customers as determined by the Oglala Lakota County Sheriff.

This MOA shall be renewed annually with review.

6. MEETING AND REPORT

The County shall meet annually with the Tribe and the Prairie Wind Casino to coordinate provisions of government services to the Tribe and the Prairie Wind Casino. The County and the Prairie Wind Casino shall provide an annual written report to the Tribe describing the County's provision of the requested services, which were provided during the previous year.

7. PERFORMANCE

The parties agree to provide written notice of any situation or circumstance which inhibits the purpose or effect of this agreement to the Tribal Chairman or delegate, and the Chairman of the Oglala Lakota County Commissioners. Upon receipt of the written notice, the other party shall have 30 days to cure the alleged breach.



Dear Honorable Commissioners:

The Akicita Lakota Veterans is a non-profit organization. Our goals are to help any of the Veterans and their families with understanding the effects of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and other mental issues such as depression or anxiety. To assist with travel to and from medical appointments, getting into or returning to school or college, understanding how to get a compensable rating for disability purposes and much, much more including seeking shelter for homeless Veterans and their families.

We have a new double wide facility that is located just East of the current Oglala Sioux Tribal Veterans Shelter in Pine Ridge. Our physical and 911 address is 415 Veterans Way, Pine Ridge, SD. Our facility was just delivered, and we have scheduled for maintenance workers to install water and sewer and put skirting around the structure.

Our facility is nearly up and running, however, we need electricity. We approached Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) who is in the process of identifying a dollar figure to extend power from the closest transformer to our location. A technician from NPPD told our volunteer staff that the cost might be from \$15,000.00 to \$20,000.00 for a trenched line and hook ups. There are no overhead power lines in that area, and everything is underground.

We are humbly asking for monetary assistance in the amount of \$10,000.00 from Oglala Lakota County which will assist greatly toward advancing our goal of obtaining electrical power. Our 503(c)3 organization Employment Identification Number (EIN) is 88-1499258.


Good morning Sue.

Dear County Official:

I am pleased to notify you that on June 15, 2023, the Department of the Interior (Department) issued payments under the Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) program. The PILT program compensates eligible local jurisdictions for Federal lands administered by agencies within the Department and on behalf of the U.S. Forest Service and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Local governments may use the PILT payments for any governmental purpose, including emergency response, public schools, and roads. Since local governments cannot tax Federal lands, annual PILT payments help to defray the costs associated with maintaining important community services.

The Payments in Lieu of Taxes Act, 31 U.S.C. 6901–6907, as amended, authorized the program. The PILT Act prescribes the formula used to compute the annual payments based on annually adjusted per-acre and population variables. Prior-year Federal payments under certain revenue-sharing programs, as reported annually by States, are deducted in formulating the payment amounts. A provision in the PILT Act provides temporary compensation for recent additions to the National Park System and National Forest Wilderness Areas.

The President signed the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public Law 117–328) on December 29, 2022, providing full funding for the 2023 PILT program. More than 1,900 local jurisdictions received a total of \$578.8 million in PILT payments this year.

For 2023, your county is receiving a PILT payment of \$6,255. If you provided current bank routing and account numbers to our Interior Business Center or to the System of Awards Management (SAM), an electronic funds transfer was posted to your account on or about June 15, 2023. If you did not receive a payment or require further information, please refer to www.doi.gov/pilt. The website includes information on how to register in SAM to expedite receipt of future PILT payments. 
This Congressional Briefing will explain why HR 3073, the "Community Mental Wellness and Resilience Act of 2023" is urgently needed, what it will do, and its many benefits for communities nationwide. It was introduced in the US House by Representatives Paul Tonko (D-NY), Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA), Don Bacon (R-NE), Mary Peltola (D-AK), and Kathy Castor (D-FL). A companion bill, S 1452, was introduced in the Senate by Ed Markey (D-MA), Jeff Merkley (D-OR), and Richard Blumenthal (D-CT). Click here to see the legislative language of HR 3073.

"The Community Mental Wellness and Resilience Act of 2023" is urgently needed because mental health problems are at epidemic levels today. Even before the COVID-19 pandemic began mental health problems were rising nationwide. According to Mental Health America, last year almost 20 percent of adults, or nearly 50 million Americans, experienced a diagnosed mental illness and 5 percent had a severe mental illness. About 8 percent had a substance use disorder, 10 percent experienced an alcohol disorder, and over 11 million adults reported serious thoughts of suicide.

In addition, a 2022 CDC survey found that overall, 37 percent of students at public and private high schools reported poor mental health, including stress, anxiety, and depression. A poll by the American Psychiatric Association last year found that 53 percent of adults with children under 18 said they are concerned about the mental state of their children.

The historic storms, heatwaves, droughts, floods, wildfires, hazardous smoke events, and other emergencies and disasters the US is experiencing are aggravating these problems and creating new ones. In 2021 more that 40 percent of Americans lived in a county that was impacted by a major natural disaster. Disasters can traumatize 20-40 percent of those who are directly impacted, 10-20 percent of disaster response workers, and 5-10 percent of the general population who are not directly affected but know someone who is or view the events from afar. Consequently, the number of people who experience a mental health problem as a result of a disaster often outweigh those with physical injuries by 40 to 1.

Although they will remain very important, there will never be enough mental health providers to assist all of the people who experience mental health problems today, and the number of people needing assistance will only grow as more toxic stresses, emergencies, and disasters occur. Extensive research by the ITRC found that to reduce today's epidemic of mental health problems, and prevent future ones, requires the use of community-led initiatives that use a public health approach to build mental wellness and resilience among all residents for all types of toxic stresses, emergencies, and disasters.

- 1. Any interest earned over \$500 in a year on these funds must be returned to the Federal Government (see 2 CFR Part 200.305(b)(9)). Interest earned under \$500 can be used toward any administrative costs that are associated with managing this grant.
- 2. The Funds must be used in complete compliance with the scope of work identified in the Project Worksheet. Absolutely no deviation from the scope of work without prior approval by SDOEM will be permitted or funded.

- 4. Permanent work (categories C G) identified in the approved Project Worksheet must be completed no later than August 27, 2024. In the event that it is evident the work will not be completed prior to that date; an extension of time may be requested to the Office of Emergency Management.
- 5. Every recipient of these funds is accountable to the State of South Dakota and the Federal Government on the use of these funds.

<u>Information notes</u> - Please take a moment to read the following important points of information and review the enclosed FEMA P.2 report and attached Project Worksheet(s) to ensure that the work described is consistent with the actual work that was completed or is to be completed on each damaged site.

Expenses incurred in FEMA category A & B (debris removal and emergency measures) are eligible for 75 percent Federal funding and 10 percent State funding, and have been paid as such, in accordance with the eligible damage identified on the Project Worksheet(s). Expenses incurred in FEMA categories C through G are eligible for 75 percent Federal funding and 10 percent State funding, and have been paid as such, in accordance with the eligible damage identified on the Project Worksheet(s).

An applicant has the right to appeal this reimbursement or Project Worksheet(s) related to this reimbursement and is only possible within 60 days of this letter.
