Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the Sheriff Department fuel transfers to reimburse the Highway Department for 79.9 gallons of fuel at \$3.2475 to equal \$259.48.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the Sheriff Department fuel transfers to reimburse the Highway Department of 41.8 gallons of fuel at \$3.2475 to equal \$135.75.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve the State of South Dakota Joint Powers Financial and Maintenance Agreement between the Department of Transportation and Oglala Lakota County and authorize the Chairwoman to sign.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to accept the Highway Department's monthly report.

Mark Mesteth, Sheriff, met with the Board. He requested that the County provide health insurance for any employees wishing to have it. He then provided an update regarding the MOU that he is trying to get with the OST Public Safety for jurisdictional cooperation and an MOU with the OST Court System so he can run background checks through their system as well as the State system when looking at information for individuals applying for Concealed Carry Permits. He would like to purchase new ignition switches for the 2 County owned side by side UTVs as there has been attempted, but no successful contact with former Sheriff Herman to see if he may still have possession of the keys. Lastly, he relayed to the Board that Bernardo Rodriguez would like to work as a part-time Deputy Sheriff to obtain his certification. He is willing to volunteer. At this time, there is not a need for this. Mesteth will let the Board know if an uptick of calls warrants revisiting this.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to purchase new ignition systems in the amount of approximately \$120.00.

The Auditor will reach out to Risty benefits for information on obtaining health insurance for Oglala Lakota County employees.

Mesteth also provided updates regarding community outreach with an emphasis on County schools. He will be attending all sporting events for public safety.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins to accept the Sheriff Department's monthly report.

Jerlene Arredondo, Veteran Service Officer, met with the Board. She provided an old version of her report. She will get a new one typed up and sent to the Auditor's Office in a more detailed format. Arredondo then reported on the VSO Conference that she attended and VA Stand Down in Rapid City on September 19, 2024 in Rapid City.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve moving the location of the County VSO from the Veterans' Shelter to the Veterans' Center Trailer. Arredondo will talk to the person in charge of the rental agreement and ask them to send an email with the agreement and amount.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to accept the VSO monthly report and place it on file.

Arredondo then let the Board know that Senator Rounds' Representative will be in Kyle to discuss Veteran Affairs, a PSA was sent out.

Dean Steele was not available via telephone to discuss his request to the next meeting.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to move the request for ag status to include possible refund and/or abatement, to the next meeting.

TJ Plume and Vanessa Plume, Alpha One Fire & Rescue Board Members, met with the Board via telephone with a request of \$25,150.00 to aid in their fund-raising efforts. They were also inquiring about County paid Workman's Compensation Insurance Coverage.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded Hopkins, to revisit the requests at a future meeting with Alpha One Fire & Rescue in attendance in person.

Sue Ganje, Auditor, met with the Board to provide them with a listing of what the Opioid Monies can be used for under the requirements of the grant received and asked them to review them for the next meeting. Ganje then updated the Board that the County will be allocated \$372.59 to supplement Indigent Defense brought about by HB 1057.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to have State's Attorney Russell draft a letter that Oglala Lakota County strongly recommends that there be at least 2 indigent individuals be part of the committees that works on House Bills that benefit County paid costs due to State Laws that require them, ie. HB 1057.





# <u>62-1-5</u>. Fire department, ambulance service, and rescue squad volunteers--Employees of county, municipality, special purpose district, or township--Imputed wage.

All persons providing voluntary service to a fire department, ambulance service, or rescue squad for any county, municipality, special purpose district, or township if regularly organized under the law shall be deemed employees of such county, municipality, special purpose district, or township while in the performance of their duties as members, if recommended by the person in charge to the governing body of such county, municipality, special purpose district, or township for membership and appointed by such governing body, and has not been removed by such governing body as members. For the purpose of computing compensation, the members shall be considered to be earning a wage that would entitle the members to the maximum compensation for death or injury allowable under this title. But in no event may payments to the members exceed the maximum limitations for benefits as set out in this title.

For purposes of determining compensation, any remuneration received by a member who voluntarily serves may not be considered.

# <u>62-1-5.1</u>. Volunteers serving state or political subdivision without pay--Computing or imputing wage--Certain persons not deemed volunteers.

Any volunteer worker rendering services in or for any agency, department, institution, or instrumentality of the state or of any of its political subdivisions, including counties, townships, school districts, or municipalities, whose services have been duly recommended to the officer or governing body responsible for employment of personnel for the respective entity and duly appointed thereto by such officers or governing body, shall for purposes of this title be deemed an employee of the state or the political subdivision, as the case may be. The appointment shall be entered into the official records or minutes of the entity.

In the event of injury or death, for the purposes of computing compensation for volunteer workers other than volunteer firefighters, a volunteer uncompensated worker's employment earnings from all sources during the last six months of employment shall be used. In the event the volunteer uncompensated worker has never been employed, the worker shall be considered to be earning the state minimum wage over a forty-hour week. The worker's average weekly wage shall be calculated by one of the methods in §§ 62-4-25 to 62-4-27, inclusive. In no event may payments to volunteer uncompensated workers exceed the maximum limitations for benefits as set out in this title. No local prisoner, state inmate, or federal inmate providing services to the state or any of its political subdivisions may be considered a volunteer worker under this section.

# <u>62-1-5.2</u>. Requirements for volunteer firefighters to become eligible for workers' compensation—Amount of benefits—Limitation on eligibility.

Any firefighter who is a member of any county, municipal, special purpose district, township, or private nonprofit corporation operating as a fire department that has on file a cooperative fire suppression agreement with the South Dakota Department of Public Safety, and has been approved by the governing body for assignment to the state, is eligible for workers' compensation benefits from the state if injured during a period of time commencing from the time dispatched by the secretary of public safety until the time the firefighter returns to the location from which the firefighter was originally dispatched by the secretary of public safety. In the event of injury or death, the firefighter shall, for the purpose of computing compensation, be considered to be earning a wage that would entitle that person to the maximum compensation for death or injury allowable under this title; but in no event may payments to any firefighter exceed the maximum limitations for benefits as set out in this title.

For purposes of determining compensation any remuneration received by a member who voluntarily serves the department may not be considered.

No firefighter under this section may be deemed a state employee for any purpose other than eligibility to receive workers' compensation from the state under this section.
