Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve allocating \$20,000.00 of County Opioid Settlement Funds to Oaye Luta Okolakiciye (Moving Forward in a Sacred Way).

Bear Runner entered the meeting at 1:12 p.m.

Favian Kennedy, Director of the Oglala Lakota Division of Behavioral Health and Tamara Marshall, reported to the Board regarding their services. Discussion was held on funding, with Yellow Bull offering funding from the Opioid Settlements Fund in the amount of \$20,000.00.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve allocating \$20,000.00 of County Opioid Settlement Funds to the Oglala Lakota Division of Behavioral Health. The County will need a written proposal and request for funding before disbursement.

Lynx Bettelyoun, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board.

Fuel quotes were provided for 700 gallons of propane: Westco quoted \$1.949/gallon; Vollan Oil quoted \$1.95/gallon. Lakota Plains and Discount Fuels, Inc did not provide a bid.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to approve and accept the low bid from Westco at \$1.949/gallon.

Bettelyoun provided his monthly report.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to accept the Highway Department's monthly report.

The time being 9:30 a.m., the Private Road Work Hearing took place. Motion made by Hopkins, seconded by Yellow Bull, to approve to continue providing Private Road Work at a rate of \$150.00/hr.

Mark Mesteth, Sheriff, met with the Board to present the Sheriff's Department monthly report and give updates.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Bear Runner, to accept the Sheriff's monthly report.

Jerlene Arredondo, Veteran Service Officer, met with the Board to provide updates and submit the monthly report. Comer signed the rental agreement with the Akicita Lakota Veterans for use of the 2023 Double-wide Modular located at 415 Veterans Ave, Pine Ridge, SD 57770 with a term of 5 years beginning November 1, 2024 and reviewed annually on October 1, 2025. The payment is \$100.00/month totaling \$1,200.00/year.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to accept the VSO monthly report and place it on file.

Bear Runner left the meeting at 2:50 p.m.

Sue Ganje, Auditor, met with the Board to request a few actions to clarify some previous actions taken.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the clarification on the use of ARPA monies, retroactively to May of 2023 to use for General and Highway salaries and benefits 2022 through 2024, contracted salaries for 2022 through 2025 and for the purchase of the snow blower and fuel tanks for the Highway Department.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve the clarification that General Fund monies were used for Wounded Knee School Water Storage Project rather than ARPA monies.

Discussion was held regarding employees' full-time status. Yellow Bull wants to know exactly how much money the County has. He wants to have a working session on the next agenda.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve travel for any Commissioners wishing to attend the NACo Western Interstate Region Conference in Pennington County, South Dakota, May 21-23, 2025 at a rate of \$475.00/person.

Teresa Pullen, Treasurer, met with the Board on behalf of Joseph Whiting.

Motion made by Yellow Bull, seconded by Hopkins, to approve a payment plan of \$150.00 every 2 weeks until the delinquent taxes have been brought current.

Proposal for Lakota Summer Youth Camp: Opioid Prevention Through Cultural Connection

Project Title: Hesapa Lakota Wakanyeja Wicoti – Black Hills Lakota Youth Camp

Funding Request: \$20,000

Project Overview: The Lakota Summer Youth Camp is a four-day immersive experience designed for Lakota boys aged 7-14, hosted at Camp Bob Marshall in the Black Hills. This initiative aims to provide a culturally grounded, safe space where young Lakota men can engage in their language, survival skills, and traditional lifeways while enjoying structured outdoor activities. By investing in our youth through cultural education and experiential learning, we are directly engaging in opioid prevention by fostering identity, resilience, and connection.

Opioid Prevention Approach: Indigenous Determinants of Health highlight the urgent need for holistic and culturally relevant approaches to substance abuse prevention. Young Lakota men experience disproportionately high rates of social and economic disparities, trauma, and disconnection from traditional values—all of which contribute to vulnerability to opioids and other harmful behaviors. Factors such as historical trauma, loss of land and culture, systemic inequities, and limited access to culturally competent healthcare increase the risk of substance abuse. By strengthening their cultural identity and sense of belonging, we equip them with the foundation necessary to resist these social ills.

Objectives:

- 1. **Cultural Connection & Identity Building:** Reinforce Lakota identity through language immersion, storytelling, and ceremonies.
- 2. **Survival Skills & Outdoor Education:** Teach traditional skills such as fire-making, hunting, fishing, and land navigation to build self-sufficiency and confidence.
- 3. **Mental, Emotional & Spiritual Health**: Engage in activities that promote emotional intelligence, resilience, and traditional healing practices.
- 4. **Fun & Physical Activity:** Provide structured outdoor activities including hiking, archery, and group challenges that foster teamwork and well-being.

Camp Structure:

- Day 1 (Half-Day): Arrival, introductions, language-based team-building activities.
- Day 2 (Full-Day): Survival skill training, Lakota language immersion, and outdoor activities.
- Day 3 (Full-Day): Storytelling, ceremonies, and mentorship with Lakota elders/leaders.
- Day 4 (Half-Day): Reflection, honoring, give-away, and closing ceremonies.

Dear Fall River County Auditor:

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is a federal agency that works with private landowners to help them conserve, maintain, and improve their natural resources. The NRCS emphasizes voluntary, science-based conservation; technical assistance; partnerships; incentive-based programs; and cooperative problem solving at the community level. As a federal agency, the NRCS complies with the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966 and is required to consider historic properties (i.e., buildings, structures, archeological sites, objects, and districts eligible or listed in the National Register of Historic Places) that may be affected by projects receiving technical and/or financial assistance from NRCS. To assist the NRCS in identifying historic properties (also called cultural resources) that may be important to different communities or groups, we are soliciting public involvement and consultation on our activities. We are asking you to please respond to this letter if your organization has specific concerns related to the location of historic properties. While the SD NRCS has professional cultural resource specialists on staff and each project with the potential to affect historic properties is checked for known archeological sites and national or state register listed properties, local communities are often aware of other resources in their rural areas that have not been previously identified or recorded. If your organization does have locations of cultural resource concerns, please identify these general areas on a town or county map and return the map to our office within 45 days of receipt of this letter. As our office reviews future program applications, the NRCS will identify activities that have the potential to affect historic properties and consult with any identified interested public official on a projectby-project basis. If you have no specific concerns, you may either notify our office of such in writing or simply not respond to this letter. Also, please let the NRCS know if you are aware of any other interested individuals or groups. For your information, similar letters have also been sent to each county auditor and commissioner.
